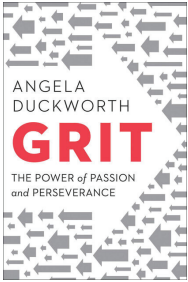

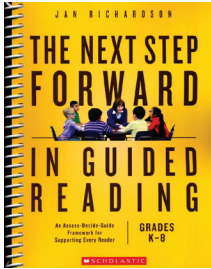

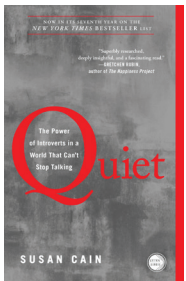
The Next Step Forward in Guided Reading by Jan Richardson

Quiet: The Power of Introverts in a World That Can't Stop Talking by Susan Cain

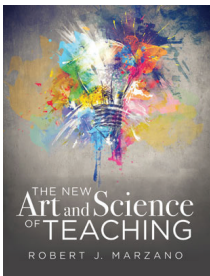

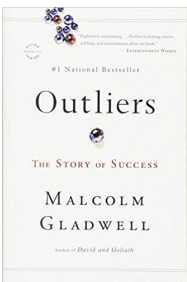


The New Art and Science of Teaching by Robert Marzano
