Course Description

Poor reading, poor handwriting, clumsiness...it all ends in a referral for the school-based therapist. But is it sensory? Behavior? ADHD? Dyslexia? Something else?? This course will teach the school-based therapist to recognize the signs of a vision-based learning problems, then assess the visual system to uncover the root cause of academic difficulty. The therapist will learn the best standardized assessments to capture the visual dysfunction and simple, inexpensive techniques to improve ocular motor skills to improve academic performance.

Objectives

- Learn to spot the signs of unrecognized vision problems affecting your student's performance.
- Learn evidence-based techniques to assess and treat visual dysfunction.
- Is it a vision problem or is it dyslexia? Learn to spot the difference.
- Learn a simple technique that could improve reading, posture and more.
